


what we deserve by nature, then we can be very thankful for God's unmerited mercy and grace.



\*Hobby Lobby CEO David Green announced last week that he is giving away the craft supply company, citing another major retailer's choice to do the same. The news was dropped within an opinion piece published on Fox News by Green on Friday, October 21. Also, in The Christian Post interview with Hobby Lobby founder and CEO David Green, he challenged business leaders to assess their source of truth.

He said, "For me, my source of truth has always been prayer and the Bible. I truly believe that if leaders pray and seek truth <u>from the Bible</u> that their businesses will be revolutionized"

Green sited the difference between inheritance and heritage, saying, "The heritage that I want to leave my children is the heritage of serving the Lord and knowing Him, and not billions or millions of dollars. I realize that all my success has come from God." He said that his wife and he started their business with just \$600.00 and trust in God.

He encouraged leaders to seek wisdom from Proverbs by reading one of the book's 31 chapters each day. He reiterated his message of stewardship in urging others to take care of what God has given to them. He said, "I chose God (over money), and try to follow Godly principles in serving Him in business and raising, our family."

## Reformation Stewardship

We mark the Reformation by Sola Scriptura acknowledging October 31, 1517, the day that Martin Luther posted

his 95 theses to the castle door at Wittenberg, in which he tackled the church's practice of

selling "indulgences." In short it was a "pay to play" scheme that allowed people to "buy" forgiveness – a teaching in direct contradiction to the Bible which assures the believer that "you were bought with a price" (1 Corinthians 6:20, 7:23). That price was the blood of Jesus Christ, a sacrifice that God deemed worthy to pay for the Bible of all sins - past, present, and future.


The Reformation exposed the heresy of financial obligation to the church in exchange for sanctification, and Luther's lifework in service to his Lord brought God's Word direct to the people, many of whom had never read the Bible for themselves. The understanding that there is no need for an intermediary in our relationship with Jesus, we see in scripture that "every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father..." (James 1:17).

When we understand that God gave His all for us, and that all we have comes from Him, there is no hesitation to live a life a stewardship. This Reformation of our hearts and minds directs us to respond to His love, pledging our time, talents, and treasures to do God's will. Our stewardship before God becomes a way of life, right alongside Bible study, worship, and prayer, offer our gifts to further His work in this kingdom while we await the coming of His eternal kingdom.

# Something You Probably Don't Know About Sunday School

Sunday School originated in late 18<sup>th</sup> century Britain, as Christians sought to serve poor children who often spent 70 to 80 hours a week working in factories. Unable to attend school, these children were not learning to read. As Sunday was the only day the factories were closed, churches opened the door to the needy young ones, helping them learn to read from the Bible, and often feeding them.

Sunday School did not set out to serve the children already attending church. Rather, it began as a community outreach to help empower working-class children to break out of the cycle of poverty. The Bible was their textbook.

Scripture tells us in Isaiah 55:11 that God declares His Word "shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose." God used their dire circumstances to draw those poverty-ridden English children into His fold.

At Trinity, it is easy to allow your children to spend time in God's Word. Sunday School meets in the parish hall following after church fellowship on Sunday mornings. Parents can also be blessed with the Bible's wisdom and riches by attending Adult Bible Class, which meets concurrently in the sanctuary.


