Old Testament Reading Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-1 1
P The Old Testament Reading is from Isaiah, the fourtieth chapter.
${ }^{1}$ The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me
to bring good news to the poor; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted,
to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound;
2to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn;
${ }^{3}$ to grant to those who mourn in Zionto give them a beautiful headdress instead of ashes,
the oil of gladness instead of mourning,
the garment of praise instead of a faint spirit;
that they may be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the LORD, that he may be glorified.
${ }^{4}$ They shall build up the ancient ruins; they shall raise up the former devastations;
they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations.
${ }^{8}$ For I the Lord love justice; I hate robbery and wrong;
I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them.
${ }^{9}$ Their offspring shall be known among the nations, and their descendants in the midst of the peoples;
all who see them shall acknowledge them, that they are an offspring the LORD has blessed.
${ }^{10}$ I will greatly rejoice in the LORD; my soul shall exult in my God,
for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation; he has covered me with the robe of righteousness,
as a bridegroom decks himself like a priest with a beautiful headdress, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels.
${ }^{11}$ For as the earth brings forth its sprouts, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to sprout up, so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to sprout up before all the nations.

P The Epistle is from 1 Thessalonians, the fifth chapter.
${ }^{16}$ Rejoice always, ${ }^{17}$ pray without ceasing, ${ }^{18}$ give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. ${ }^{19}$ Do not quench the Spirit. ${ }^{20}$ Do not despise prophecies, ${ }^{21}$ but test everything; hold fast what is good. ${ }^{22}$ Abstain from every form of evil. ${ }^{23}$ Now may the God of peace himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit and soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. ${ }^{24} \mathrm{He}$ who calls you is faithful; he will surely do it.

Holy Gospel John 1:6-8, 19-28
P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the first chapter.
C Glory to You, OLord.
${ }^{6}$ There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ${ }^{7} \mathrm{He}$ came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. ${ }^{8} \mathrm{He}$ was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.
${ }^{19}$ And this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" ${ }^{20} \mathrm{He}$ confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, "I am not the Christ." ${ }^{21}$ And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "No." ${ }^{22}$ So they said to him, "Who are you? We need to give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" ${ }^{23} \mathrm{He}$ said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' as the prophet Isaiah said."
${ }^{24}$ (Now they had been sent from the Pharisees.) ${ }^{25}$ They asked him, "Then why are you baptizing, if you are neither the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?" ${ }^{26}$ John answered them, "I baptize with water, but among you stands one you do not know,
${ }^{27}$ even he who comes after me, the strap of whose sandal I am not worthy to untie."
${ }^{28}$ These things took place in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.
